

QUESTIONS FOR STUDY AND DISCUSSION

1. Before you became a Christian, do you remember anyone personally sharing their faith with you? Were you led to faith in Christ by someone sharing their faith with you? What has been your experience in sharing your faith with others?
2. I Peter 3:13-18 is set in the context of living in a hostile world as a believer. Yet, Peter calls us not to respond in silence. How does Peter call us not to respond in verse 14? What does he call us to do in verse 15? What does it mean to “sanctify Christ as Lord in our hearts”? How is this helpful in not being afraid to speak for Christ?
3. In verse 15, Peter tells us to be ready to give a defense for the hope in us. How can we prepare ourselves for this? Read (1) 1 Corinthians 15:1-7; (2) 1 Corinthians 15:8-10; 1 Timothy 1:15-16; (3) Colossians 4:3; (4) John 4:7-15 and (5) John 4:34-36. Some of the ways we can prepare ourselves to speak of Christ are having a burden for the lost, understanding the Gospel, prayer, giving our testimony and building a bridge to an unbeliever. Match up the preceding five passages with these ways of being ready.
4. With the following outline, consider how you might share your faith.
