

## QUESTIONS FOR STUDY AND DISCUSSION

1. After the resurrection, Jesus appears to two disciples on the road to Emmaus. It is a well known scene found in Luke 24:13-31. Specifically in verse 27, what does He talk with them about? What does this tell us about the various themes and unity of Scripture?
2. Some people say that Christians don't really need the Old Testament. How would Peter respond to this in verses 10-12? In these verses, Peter gives us insight into the work of the prophets. What is their work and ultimately who is it for? Some people say only God's law is central to the Old Testament; this is not the case. How do we see God's grace (verse 10) in various parts of the Old Testament?
3. Also in these verses, a work of the Holy Spirit is described. How is His ministry presented? Read 2 Peter 1:20-21 for additional understanding. Stop for a moment and give the Holy Spirit thanks for the Scripture and how He teaches you through It.
4. In verse 11, what two parts of Christ's ministry did the prophets seek after? Describe these two areas. Why are they so important? Can you give Old Testament references for each one? Reflecting on each one, how are they inseparable from your Christian life?
5. Based on this verse, who should we look for carefully in each passage we read? Read 2 Corinthians 1:18-20. How is Christ the fulfillment of every promise?—for example, His promise through Paul (Philippians 4) of peace that passes all understanding.
6. In verse 12, a somewhat cryptic statement is made. What is Peter referring to about angels in this verse? What in God's revelation do you think angels who are not omniscient, but are holy, were so interested in knowing? Think about the fall and God's relationship to His unholy children.
7. These are deep verses giving a sweeping overview of God's great Covenant of Grace. As you close this study, consider three or four practical ways you can apply this passage to your relationship with God, yourself and in interaction with others?
